Fiona Ma is California's 34th State Treasurer. She was elected on November 6, 2018 with more votes (7,825,587) than any other candidate for treasurer in the state's history. She is the first woman of color and the first woman Certified Public Accountant (CPA) elected to the position.

The State Treasurer's Office was created in the California Constitution in 1849. It provides financing for schools, roads, housing, recycling and waste management, hospitals, public facilities, and other crucial infrastructure projects that better the lives of residents.

Treasurer Ma was a member of the State Assembly from 2006-2012, serving as Speaker pro Tempore from 2010 to 2012. From 2002-2006, she served on the San Francisco Board of Supervisors and championed a human rights campaign to end human trafficking in massage parlors and to close prostitution rings. She led an effort to create the city's Disadvantaged Business Enterprise program to empower small businesses to more easily participate in public works projects. Treasurer Ma has been a licensed CPA in California since 1992 and holds a Bachelor's Degree in Accounting from the Rochester Institute of Technology (NY), a Master's Degree in Taxation from Golden Gate University (SF), and an MBA from Pepperdine University.

**Special Guest: Malia M. Cohen, California State Controller

State Controller Malia M. Cohen was elected in November 2022, following her service on the California State Board of Equalization (BOE), the nation's only elected tax commission responsible for administering California's \$100 billion property tax system. She was elected to the BOE in November 2018 and was Chair in 2019 and 2022. As Controller, she continues to serve the Board as its fifth voting member.

II. Introduction of our Guest Speaker: Jennifer Santana, Board President, Upper San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District

Jennifer Santana was first elected to the Board of Directors for the Upper San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District (Upper District) in November 2018 to represent Division 5, which includes the cities of El Monte, Baldwin Park, and Duarte. She is the first woman ever elected to the board and currently serves as the first



woman President.

Jennifer graduated from the University of California, Davis with a degree in Biochemistry and Molecular Biology. She became a certified Cytogeneticist in 2007 and published and presented her cancer research as first author at the Association of Genetic Technologists Annual Meeting in 2012. She has built a career in science, working at City of Hope, a nationally recognized comprehensive cancer research hospital, for more than 17 years. She received recognition from the California State Senate in 2013 for her efforts to encourage young women to pursue careers in math, science, and technology.

Jennifer is a mother of three and active in her community. As a long-time San Gabriel Valley resident, she became concerned about the region's water supply during the 2014 California Drought. Her priorities are

fiscally prudent governance and long-term water resource planning to meet the needs of the San Gabriel Valley.

Jennifer serves as Upper District's representative on the boards of the Main San Gabriel Basin Watermaster, the San Gabriel Valley Protective Association, and the San Gabriel Valley Water Association
